County Considers Solar Farm Regulations

STAFF REPORT

Harper County representatives met with Douglas County representatives via a video conference call Monday morning.

County commissioners and Harper County Appraiser Brooke Mantey were seeking guidance on Douglas County's solar farm regulations.

The northern Kansas county is in

the processing of working through its initial application for a solar farm that will incorporate more than 1,000 acres near Lawrence.

Currently, Harper County's comprehensive development plan is out of date, and the county does not have any regulations or restrictions on solar farms.

District #1 Commissioner Brian Waldschmidt said the county is al-

ready behind the eight ball when it comes to solar energy regulation. He wondered if the county was going to be able to move fast enough to put restrictions and regulations in place before a commercial solar farm was ready to be built in Harper County.

Mantey said there has been some commercial interest to install a solar farm within the county borders.

Douglas County said they included payment in lieu of taxes requirements much like those that are paid by wind farm operators within Harper County. They did say there is a difference in what counties are able to get from solar farms as compared to wind farms.

Waldschmidt and District #2 Commissioner Jeff Vornauf both expressed concerns over potential

pushback from county land owners on both sides of the issue.

Vornauf said he felt as though residents in his area would make up their own minds before an official decision by the county.

County commissioners said the comprehensive plan needs to be updated and then the county's zoning board can start working on potential regulations.

City of Harper Intends to Purchase New Fire Truck

Harper County Community Foundation Executive Director Kevin Alexander spoke with Harper County commissioners Monday morning regarding a pair of fire department purchases.

Alexander said both the Attica and Harper Fire Departments planned to make purchases using yearly funds the county makes available to the three county fire departments from payment in lieu of taxes paid by wind farm operators within the county. Originally the county gave each fire department \$50,000 a year. That amount was lowered to \$25,000 recently.

Alexander said Attica was looking to purchase a new tanker truck for its department, which costs just under \$150,000. The unit will be purchased from a company in Parsons.

A \$37,000 down payment will be issued through funds with HCCF.

The city of Harper will issue general obligation bonds to purchase its fire truck. Then the annual income stream from the county's PILOT payments will be used to pay off the bonds so long as the funds are available each year.

Harper City Administrator Tiffany Hartson said the city was aware the yearly payments made to the fire departments could end at some point.

The city was also requesting that the payments from

Winter Canola Meeting Scheduled for Harper

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Kansas State University, Oklahoma State University and the Great Plains Canola Association will host two regional winter canola meetings Aug. 6-7.

The Aug. 6 meeting will be held in Harper at the Westview Lodge, 1110 W. 14th. The meeting will begin at 5:30 p.m.

The Aug. 7 meeting is in Enid, Okla., at the Hoover Building, 300 E. Oxford Ave. The meeting will begin at 10 a.m.

K-State canola breeder Mike Stamm said the meetings are an opportunity to learn about variety performance from the past year, as well as future varieties. He said production management topics such as pre- and in-season nitrogen applications, winter survival, and harvest management will be discussed.

Stamm notes that questions related to marketing the

crop are still a critical topic. He adds that attendees will be able to hear from an experienced grower panel.

“With canola acres up this past year, there is interest in how the crop performed,” he said. “Overall, growers are pleased with their yields. Learning from our experiences will set the stage for a strong start to the next growing season.”

A meal will be sponsored by the Great Plains Canola Association and industry partners.

Bids Approved for Two State Highway Projects in County

STAFF REPORT

The Kansas Department of Transportation has announced approved bids for state highway construction and maintenance projects. The letting took place July 17 in Topeka.

Two projects have been approved for Harper County. The first is eight miles of Kansas Highway 2, from the north city limits of Anthony, north to the K-2/K-14/U.S. 160 junction in the city of Harper, for crack repair. Pavement Pro's LLC of McPherson had the winning bid of \$65,682.

The second is for 17.6 miles of U.S. Highway 160, from the Barber/Harper county line east to the U.S. 160/K-2 junction, for crack repair. Pavement Pro's of McPherson also had the winning bid for this project, at a cost of \$113,405.28.

HCCF be made directly to the city instead of being paid directly to the vendor as it has been done in the past.

Commissioners said they did not have an issue with the foundation paying funds directly to the city.

Chairman Darrin Struble asked if a policy change needed to be made if the other two county fire departments wanted payments made to their departments instead of the vendors. Alexander said it would be better to review each instance on a case by case basis to make a decision instead of making a policy change.

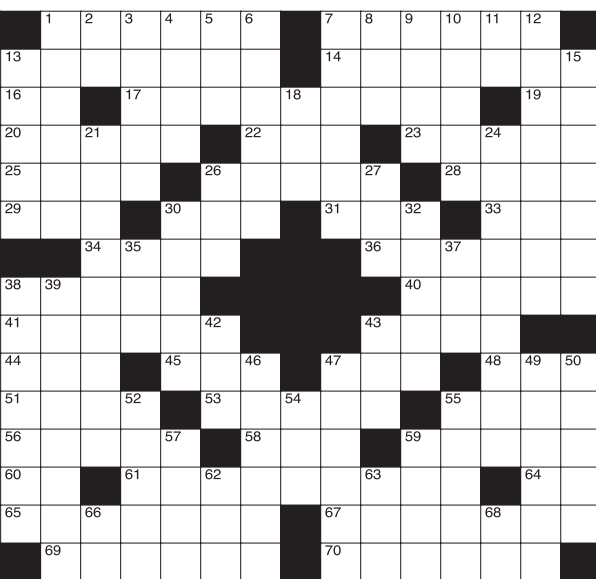

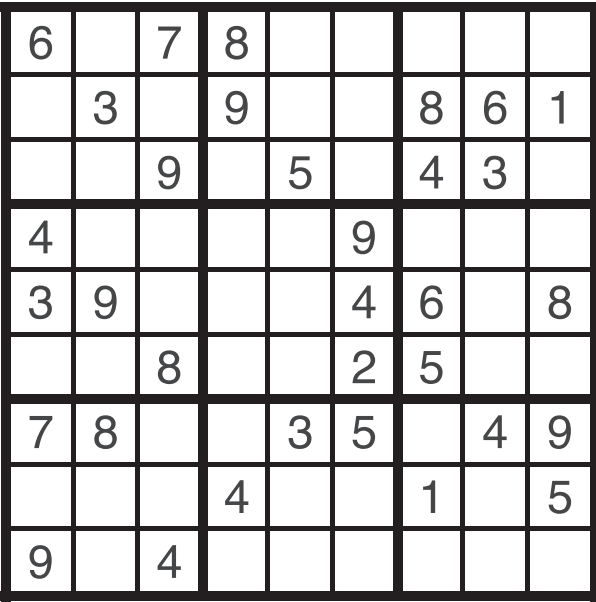

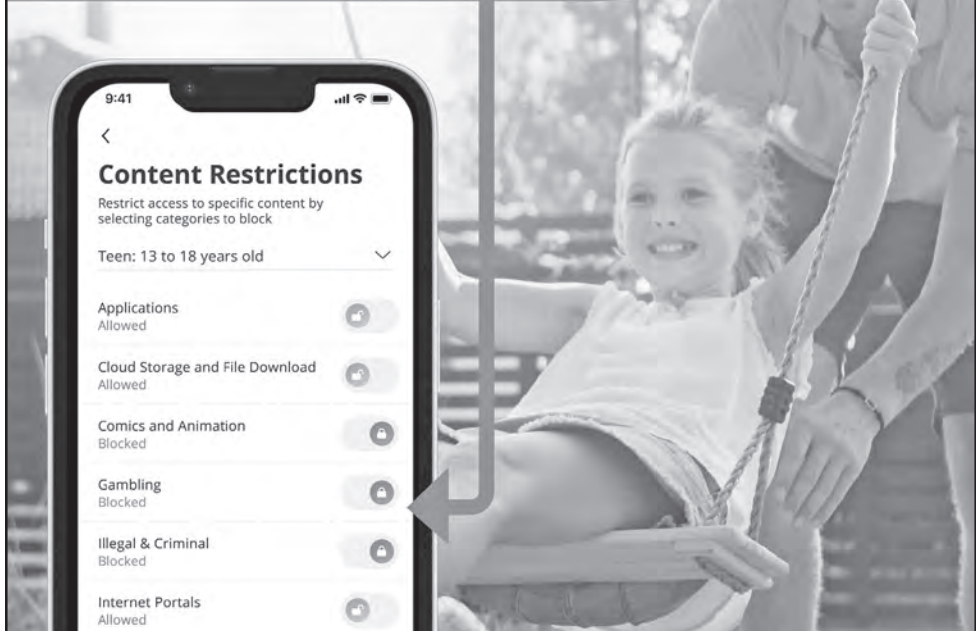
