County Approves Budget With Mill Below RNR

The Kingman County commissioners Monday approved the 2026 budget, in which the county got the mill levy slightly below the revenue neutral rate.

The mill levy was set at 61.135, which is a little less than the county's revenue neutral rate of 61.196.

There was no public input during the public hearing at Monday's meeting. The vote to approve the

budget was 2-0, with County Commission Chairwoman Julie Lyon absent.

During discussion, County Commissioner Jack Thimesch said that the commissioners worked hard to hold the line, but sometimes he wondered how often people think about the work the commissioners do most of the time.

But Thimesch said his concern was not just about residents his age but what future he is leaving for "my kids and grandkids."

He added he talked to a woman who recently moved to the area and said, if her property taxes keep going up, she will have to move because she cannot afford the property taxes.

Also at Monday's meeting, Thimesch and County Commissioner Pat Elpers talked about what they saw at the Barton County Courthouse, which they both toured Friday as they learn more about options for upgrading the heating, ventilation and air conditioning

system at the Kingman County Courthouse.

The county is considering other projects that might be completed when it comes time to do HVAC work, given that the county will have to vacate the courthouse while work takes place.

Thimesch said, in speaking to Barton County employees, that painting the walls would be "a must" to complete while work is done on HVAC. He added that Barton County got some floor tiles re-

placed with carpeting in some places, but in other places, the flooring remained the same.

He noted that Barton County did a lot of work on ceilings, which is something Kingman County would need to consider.

Thimesch mentioned that Barton County is in an historic district and had some access to tax credits, but the Kingman County Courthouse is a historic building and the county

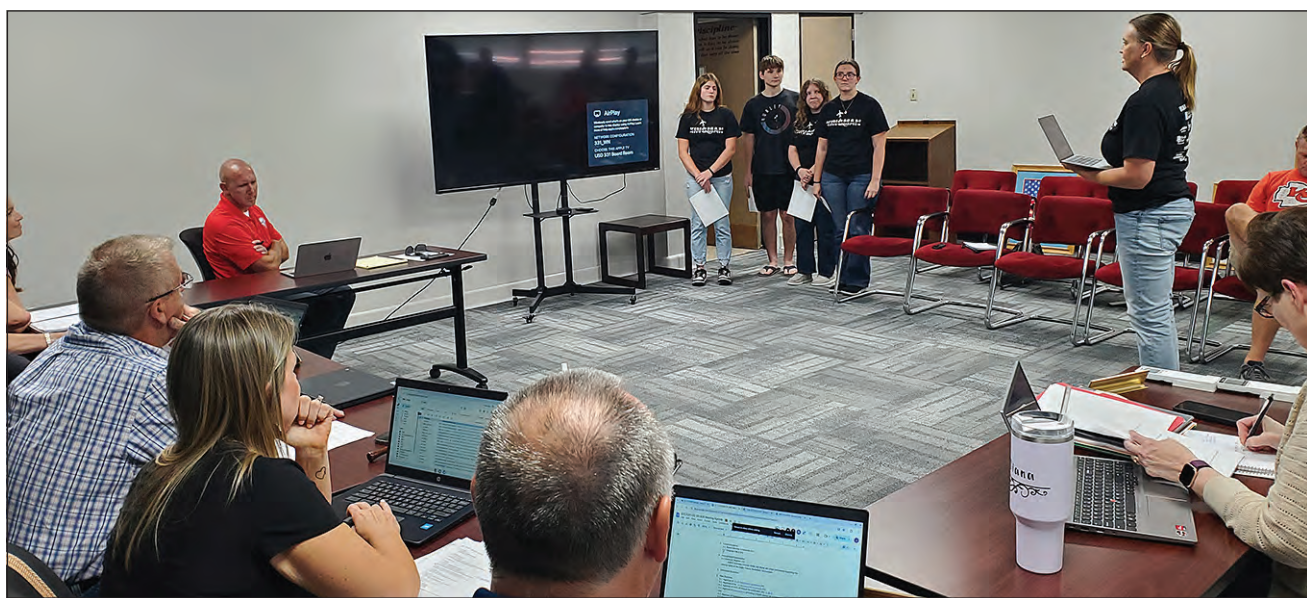

Many New USD 331 Teachers Have Ties to Schools, County

There are 10 teachers in USD 331 who are new to teaching in the district, though several have ties to the schools or county, along with a teacher who previously taught in USD 331 and has returned, and a teacher who started late last year.

School will officially start for all students Wednesday, Aug. 20. There will be open houses at each of the schools Aug. 19, with Kingman Elementary School open house

starting at 5 p.m., Kingman Middle-High School open house starting at 5:30 p.m. and Norwich School open house starting at 6 p.m.

Here are the new teachers in USD 331:

Suganya Balakrishnan

Balakrishnan was previously the resource room teacher at Kingman Elementary School, then spent the past three years in an individualized education program position with South

Central Kansas Special Education Cooperative.

She now returns to teaching and will be the resource room teacher at Kingman Middle-High School. She and her family have lived in Kingman since 2009. Balakrishnan has been involved with education for 17 years.

"It is like coming back home," she said, adding that she missed teaching but learned a lot about how to be a better teacher from her work the past three years

and that it will benefit her in leading the classroom.

Michaela Gillen

Gillen started in September last year as a kindergarten teacher at Kingman Elementary School. She will now start her first full year as a teacher.

Gillen worked a paraprofessional for five years at Kingman Elementary before becoming a teacher. She graduated from Willard High School in Willard, Mo., and

is completing her college degree at Wichita State University.

"I absolutely love it here," Gillen said. "I like to teach the little new things and watch them grow."

Benjamin Klausmeyer

Klausmeyer is a 2014 graduate of Cheney High School and attended University of Kansas. He will teach English language arts at Kingman Middle-High School and it will be his first

teaching job.

He entered another field after graduating college but said things didn't pan out. Klausmeyer then worked as a paraprofessional for four years in Lawrence and decided to pursue a teaching career, so he returned to KU to get his degree in secondary education.

Klausmeyer said he learned about the opening at KMHS, had a great interview

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might be able to get more in tax credits.

As for HVAC work, Thimesch said the contractor did a great job with the work. He and Elpers discussed some of the work completed, with Elpers noting that some

Barton County Courthouse offices had individual units that reminded him of what one would find in hotels.

One thing Thimesch mentioned about relocating any county offices was that Barton County officials said, "Don't do it yourselves." He said that Barton County contracted with a moving com-

pany to do that work.

The county has discussed possible locations to temporarily house county offices while HVAC and other work takes place. The Kingman Expo Center has been cited as one possible location. Thimesch added that he has visited with Kingman Mayor Jon Wollen about possibly

locating county offices at the Kingman army.

County Financial Officer LaDawn Stegman mentioned what the county could possibly do to keep the aesthetics of a historic building at the county courthouse, using the example of new doors that fit the aesthetics of a historic building.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

My concern about current Kingman County fiscal policy prompted this letter. The county was out of compliance with the Kansas state regulations for the 2023 tax year. The appraiser has a variety of approved methods to use for residential and commercial appraisals. She chose the indexed value method which was a conservative method at the time. However, she used a lower percentage than the state set. The extreme increase in the values of homes over the last several years was probably the determining factor for the state to set that percentage. The state sets these standards to give some uniformity to taxes across the state and to prevent some rogue appraisers or county officials from subjectively taxing certain individuals. She was well aware of the effect higher taxes would have on Kingman County residents.

The state standards were set many years ago and have been viewed by neighboring states as some of the most impartial and fairest around. They aren't the

action of the current governor. The state of Kansas currently gets less than 1 percent of the taxes of homes in the city of Kingman, while local entities get the rest. In townships and other cities that percentage varies a bit.

If Kingman County is consistently out of compliance, there will be ramifications to county officials or individually to the appraiser. The downside to being under appraised is that at some time the appraisals may have to take a huge jump and the state will come down and become our appraiser. The county appraiser is well aware of this and I am sure does not intend to allow that to happen. You can't consistently ignore state law and get away with it. If you have questions concerning your appraisal, go in and talk to the appraiser's office seeking information rather than yelling and complaining. She is very qualified and chose to take the punch for you.

Agricultural land is valued by the state with a complex formula of soil types, commodity prices,

etc. This is completely out of our local appraiser's hands.

However, the three county commissioners are having discussions about going over the state authority on agricultural land and reclassifying some lands as recreational which would drastically increase the value of that land. What is recreational land? Would a cabin in your pasture, a pond in your pasture, lack of quality fencing, a contract with an outfitter, the purchase price, out of state land-owners, non-farmer owned, tree infested, throw it into the recreational category? This would be very subjective and could easily get out of hand. I don't think commissioners should assume this authority.

The commissioners have increased fees for county residents and decreased services. They have eliminated employees and doubled the work load on existing employees. They have "saved" money and paid cash for a LEC with offices the size of closets so that the city needed other facilities. They have bor-

rowed money for roads (because bonding roads does not require a vote of the residents). How have they done with saving for an emergency (capital improvement accounts).

Let's look at revenue. Since 2017 the county has received \$2.8 million in one-time payments from the three working wind farms, with another \$1.5 million expected when farms 4 and 5 go on the grid. In addition, they receive over \$1.6 million a year in PILOT payments, with additional yearly payments when the last two farms go on the grid. All the wind farms didn't start in 2017 so don't multiply that by eight. How much did the county receive in sales taxes? The annual county budget is a little over seven million.

Do your research, consider the potential issues of the future and decide if the commissioners are conservative, big spenders or if they are just kicking the ball down the road.

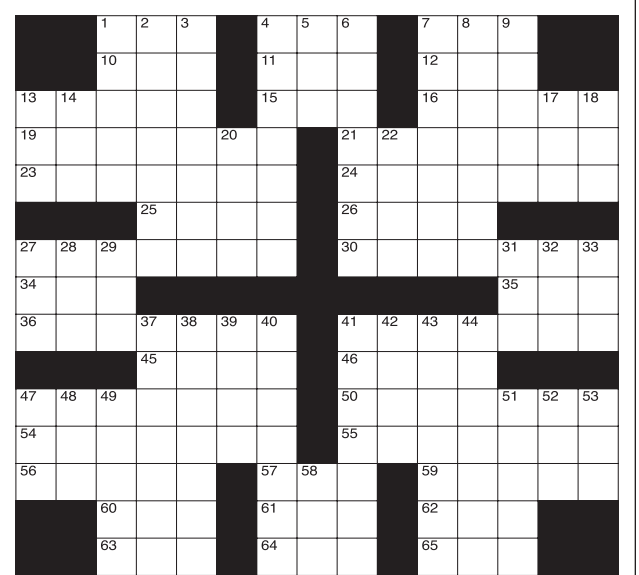
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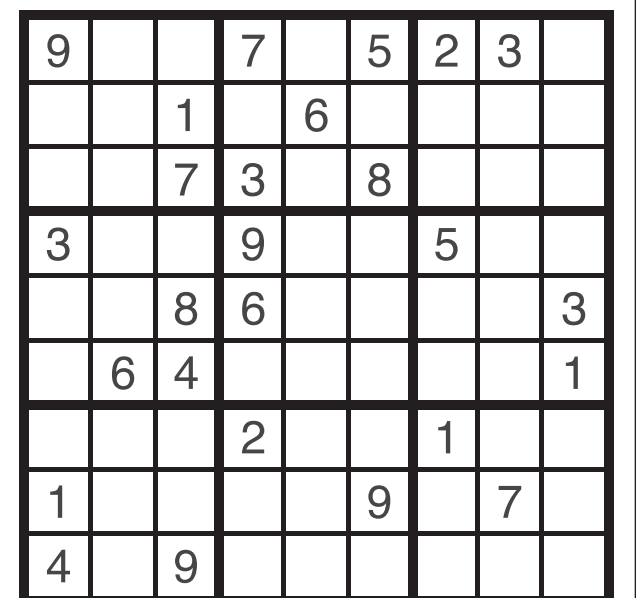

Love, Set in Stone

Last week I dragged Uncle Byron out to Willowdale to visit my ancestors. They're not at St. Peter's cemetery — just their earthly remains — but I love visiting the memorials, the blocks of stone that say "Helen was here, and Bridget, and Mabel, and the sort-of-cranky old maid Julia." These women shaped my life, without even knowing it (Mom knew). As did the men: Lawrence, Pat, and William. Pat and Bridget were my great-grandparents, their son Billy married Mabel, and their grandson Lawrence married Helen. The sort-of-cranky Julia was my great aunt. (I never met my old maid uncles.)

Thomas Lynch, one of my favorite writers, is a third-generation mortician in Michigan. Irish ancestry, like mine. He writes about his work and his readers ponder mortality with him, and the vitality of life here above ground. He quotes another writer who said that gravestones were like seashells on the shore of eternity. I love that. A living creature is gone, but the granite memorials, like the shells on the sand, remind us that someone was here, and recalls their beauty.

So Uncle and I went to Willowdale to tend to those stone seashells, with a clipper and a whisk broom and the love and respect for those we miss. And when we — uncle, me, you — visit these stones we are saying, "I miss you. I love you. I remember you, even if we never met on this earth." Patrick and Bridget and their young son, Felix, came here in the hopes that the drier air would help Felix's tuberculosis. It didn't. He died before they

finished their bright new home on the Cleveland Ridge.

Felix is the reason we're here, as is old Ed McKenna, Bridget's uncle, who was a county pioneer. Ed and most of the McKennas are buried at Walnut Hill, our Kingman city cemetery. I visit them often, too, to say thanks and ponder my lovely Kansas life.

I love being close to my parents' graves. They have a beautiful headstone in the most peaceful spot in the county — well, in a close tie with the old

family farm near Willowdale. I love being near that pink stone, with their names and mine, too ("Parents of..."), and Dad's quote engraved on the back, which was his charge to me and my brother as he lay in his last days. "Love people, serve people. Make a difference."

It's what he did, and what we try to do every day. It's good to read the reminder, which is truly set in stone so we won't forget.

Reading that makes me miss him and my dear mom. Lately I've been sore-hearted thinking

of Mama. Even as I type this I am blinking tears.

My brother and I lived with her and cared for her for 16 years, so she was my roommate, my dear companion and my occupation, as her unofficial home health nurse.

So many things remind me of her, all over my house and my heart. Which is why I was recently compelled to accost a perfect stranger on Main Street, who happened to be wearing a
